ELIGIBILITY

Hampton-Newport News Achievement Scholarship in honor of Lucius C. Wyatt (\$1,000)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Demonstrate academic excellence
- 3. Have an interest in a career in business and entrepreneurship
- 4. Possess a commitment to civic contribution

Hampton-Newport News Achievement Scholarship in honor of Arthur M. Price, Jr. (\$1,000)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Be accepted for admission and attend a Historically Black College or University. Priority will be given to applicants attending North Carolina A&T State University, Hampton University or Norfolk State University
- 3. Possess an excellent academic record and leadership potential. Students should have at least a minimum cumulative high school grade point average of 3.0 and a Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) score of at least 1000
- 4. Have demonstrated an excellent record of conduct, leadership potential and community involvement
- 5. Financial need will be considered

Robert D. Ayers, Jr. Scholarship (\$1,000)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Must have a GPA between 2.5 and 3.5
- 3. Must be active in the community and school
- 4. Must exhibit compassion and concern for others
- 5. Must be accepted to and plan on attending an HBCU
- 6. Financial need will be considered

Hampton-Newport News Achievement Scholarship in memory of Norris E. Lamb (\$1,000)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Be accepted for admission and attend a Historically Black College or University, with first consideration given to applicants attending Virginia State University
- 3. Have achieved a cumulative high school grade point average of 2.3 to 3.0 and an SAT score in the range of 820 to 1000 or ACT equivalent
- 4. Have demonstrated an excellent record of conduct, leadership potential and civic and community involvement

Hampton-Newport News Achievement Scholarship in memory of William M. Revells (\$1000)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Have a high academic achievement record, which includes at least a 3.0 grade point average (GPA) and Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) scores of at least 1000
- 3. Have an excellent conduct record and high leadership potential
- 4. Be involved in school/community activities

Gregory Williams Scholarship (\$1000, renewable for four years, college 2.5 GPA)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Have a high academic achievement record, which includes a least a 3.0 grade point average (GPA) and Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) scores of at least 1000
- 3. Have an excellent conduct record and high leadership potential
- 4. Be involved in school/community activities
- 5. Must include a financial need letter/statement

Frank J. Smith Endowed Scholarship (\$500, renewable for four years)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Be accepted for admission and attend a Historically Black College or University, with first consideration given to applicants attending Hampton University
- 3. Have achieved a cumulative high school grade point average of 2.3 to 3.0 and an SAT score in the range of 820 to 1000 or ACT equivalent
- 4. Have demonstrated an excellent record of conduct, leadership potential and civic and community involvement

Augustus L. Owens Scholarship (\$1000)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Be accepted for admission and attend a Historically Black College or University. Priority will be given to applicants attending South Carolina State University, Hampton University or Virginia State University
- 3. Have demonstrated an excellent record of conduct, leadership potential and community involvement
- 4. Financial need will be considered

Hampton-Newport News Achievement Scholarship in memory of LTC ® Curtis J. Johnson (\$1,000)

- 1. Be a graduating high school male senior
- 2. Write a one-page essay on "What are personal characteristics of a good leader?"
- 3. Provide a documented record of excellent conduct, leadership potential and civic and community involvement
- 4. Submit an official copy of your high school transcript
- 5. Have achieved a cumulative high school grade point average of no less than 2.8 and an SAT score of 900 or ACT equivalent
- 6. Be accepted for admission into an institution of higher learning
- 7. Demonstrate a need for financial support necessary to attend college

Community Knights Scholarship (\$1,000)

- 1. Live in the Hampton Roads area
- 2. Be a male or female graduating senior
- 3. Have achieved a cumulative high school grade point average of 2.75 or better and an SAT score in the range of 900 or ACT of 17
- 4. Have demonstrated an excellent record of conduct, leadership potential and civic and community involvement

Brian Gillespie Scholarship for Future Business Leaders (\$1,000)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Must be accepted to and planning to attend an HBCU
- 3. Majoring in Business or Entrepreneurship
- 4. Achieved a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher
- 5. Have demonstrated a record of excellent conduct, leadership potential and civic/community involvement

Hampton-Newport News Achievement Scholarship in memory of Dr. James B. Abram, Jr. (\$1,000)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Have a high academic achievement record, which includes:
 - a. A minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.0
 - b. A minimum Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) score of 900 or American College Testing (ACT) score of 20
- 3. Have an excellent conduct record and high leadership potential
- 4. Be involved in school and community activities
- 5. Must include a financial need letter/statement

Hampton-Newport News Achievement Scholarship in memory of William R. Walker (\$1000)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Have a high academic achievement record, which includes:
 - a. A minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.0
 - b. A minimum Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) score of 900 or American College Testing (ACT) of 20
- 3. Have an excellent conduct record and high leadership potential
- 4. Be involved in school and community activities

Hampton-Newport News Achievement Scholarship in memory of Archie C. Felton Memorial (\$1000)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Have a high academic achievement record, which includes:
 - a. A minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.0
 - b. A minimum Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) score of 900 or American College Testing (ACT) of 20
- 3. Have an excellent conduct record and high leadership potential
- 4. Be involved in school and community activities

Hampton-Newport News Achievement Scholarship in memory of Robert B. Suber, Sr. Memorial (\$1000)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Have a high academic achievement record, which includes:
 - a. A minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.0
 - b. A minimum Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) score of 900 or American College Testing (ACT) of 20
- 3. Have an excellent conduct record and high leadership potential
- 4. Be involved in school and community activities

Catherine S. Williams Education Scholarship (\$500)

- 1. Male or female graduating senior
- 2. Be accepted for admission and attend a Historically Black College or University. Priority will be given to applicants attending Tuskegee University, Hampton University or Howard University
- 3. Be accepted at a Virginia Community College with a Guaranteed Admission Agreement (2 + 2 program)
- 4. Have demonstrated an excellent record of conduct, leadership potential and community involvement
- 5. Have achieved a cumulative high school grade point average (GPA) or at least **2.5** and a minimum SAT score of **850** or ACT equivalent

Roger R. Watson, Sr. Memorial Scholarship (\$1,000)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Be accepted for admission and attend a Historically Black College or University. Priority will be given to applicants attending Virginia State University, Norfolk State University or Hampton University.
- 3. Must have a GPA of at least 2.5 or higher
- 4. A minimum SAT score of 820 or ACT score of 15
- 5. Preference given to involvement in athletics for your high schools (student athlete)
- 6. Preference will be given to a senior who has been an active participant in the Hampton-Newport News Alumni Guide Right Program
- 7. Have demonstrated an excellent record of conduct, leadership potential and community involvement
- 8. Must exhibit compassion and concern for others

Small Business Workforce Service Center Scholarships (\$1000)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior attending a four-year college or university
- 2. Must have a minimum GPA of 2.75
- 3. Major in Business or Education, leading to a four-year degree
- 4. Preference will be given to an active graduating Kappa Leaguer; this is not, however, a requirement.

Lee Arthur Lewis, Sr. Memorial Scholarship (\$1000, renewable for up to 5 years)

- 1. Be a graduating high school senior planning to attend a two-year or four-year college or university; or currently enrolled or returning undergraduate student
- 2. Priority will be given to applicants attending a Historically Black College or University (HBCU)
- 3. Participation in extracurricular or community service activities is desirable
- 4. Priority may be given to applicants with demonstrated financial need
- 5. This scholarship shall not be limited on the basis of gender
- 6. Receipt of the scholarship is contingent on acceptance to school

Hampton-Newport News Achievement Scholarship- Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. (\$1000)

- 1. Be a male graduating senior
- 2. Have a high academic achievement record, which includes:
 - a. A minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.0
 - b. A minimum Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) score of 900 or American College Testing (ACT) of 20
- 3. Have an excellent conduct record and high leadership potential
- 4. Be involved in school and community activities

- 1. A completed **typed** application form (included). Only apply once.
- 2. An official high school transcript and SAT/ACT scores
- 3. Two letters of recommendation as stipulated in part E of the application form
- 4. Applicants who wish to be considered for the Arthur M. Price, Jr., Robert D. Ayers, Jr., Augustus L. Owens, Gregory Williams, LTC ® Curtis J. Johnson and the Dr. James B. Abram, Jr. Scholarship must include a statement of financial need from your school counselor
- 5. Affix a current photograph (2×3) to the first page of the application form

The above documents, which constitute a complete application package, must be submitted to the Chairman of the Scholarship Committee at the address shown on the application form and be received to his address by **April 30, 2024 by 5pm.** Incomplete or handwritten application packages will not be considered.
